ACCEPTANCE OF THE FY 2023 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND AUDITOR'S REPORT AND AUTHORIZATION TO FORWARD TO THE COMMISSIONS

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to accept the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and associated information from the auditors and to authorize the CEO to forward this information to the commissions for their consideration.

Summary:

The audit of VRE's FY 2023 financial statements has been completed and the auditors have issued an unmodified opinion. The opinion letter states the VRE statements, in all material respects, fairly and accurately present the financial position of the organization. This opinion is the best outcome of a financial audit.





Agenda Item 9B

AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE AN INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR DELIVERY OF DIESEL FUEL FOR VRE LOCOMOTIVES

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to authorize the CEO to issue an invitation for bids for the delivery of diesel fuel to the Broad Run and Crossroads Maintenance and Storage facilities for VRE's fleet of locomotives.

Summary:

The final option year of the current diesel fuel contracts will expire on June 30, 2024. Therefore, VRE seeks to solicit bids for this service to establish new contracts for the purchase and delivery of ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel to commence July 1, 2024.

The contracts will be for a base period of one year with the option to extend for four additional one-year periods, not to exceed five years. Both contracts will be structured to allow VRE to lock in future fixed prices for some of its fuel.VRE continues to work with a consultant to assist in this process to reduce cost volatility.

CHARGE TO THE 2024 OPERATIONS BOARD OFFICERS NOMINATING COMMITTEE REGARDING SUBORDINATE OFFICER

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to approve a Charge to the Nominating Committee Regarding Subordinate Officers.

Summary:

Last year, the By-Laws Committee met several times to discuss if changes to the VRE Operations Board By-Laws were needed to adjust the membership of the Executive Committee to better ensure a balance is maintained of the interests of the two commissions, that the interests of the citizens patronizing VRE are better represented, and/or to better ensure a balance is maintained of the interests of all VRE jurisdictions and their citizens. Ultimately, the committee found changes to the By-Laws were not warranted, but rather the Nominating Committee should take those issues into consideration each year when presenting a slate of nominations for VRE Operations Board officers and consider if additional subordinate officers would help balance the Executive Committee.





AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT FOR FACILITY SECURITY SERVICES

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to authorize the CEO to execute a contract with Allied Universal Security Services of Reston, VA for facility security services in the amount of \$4,348,210 with a 10 percent contingency of \$434,821 for a total of \$4,783,031 for a base year and four option years, with the CEO exercising the option years at his discretion.

Summary:

This contract will provide private security officers to continuously patrol VRE's maintenance and storage facilities as well as support other sites, including the L'Enfant storage track, and projects where security officers are needed such as construction sites. This proposed new contract will commence immediately upon the expiration of the existing contract for facility security services which ends in December 2023.

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE A SOLE SOURCE SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT FOR AUTOMATIC PASSENGER COUNTING SYSTEM SOFTWARE AND MAINTENANCE

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to authorize the CEO to execute a sole source contract with Infodev Electronic Designers International Inc. establishing a service level agreement for automatic passenger counting system software and maintenance in the amount of \$288,412, plus a 10 percent contingency of \$28,841, for a total amount not to exceed \$317,253.

Summary:

This action provides continued support for the automated passenger counting system through hardware maintenance, technical support, and software licenses for a term of three years. As the original equipment manufacturer and system supplier, Infodev is the only viable option to provide the combination of maintenance, technical support, and software licensing for the automated passenger counting system installed on VRE's fleet of railcars.

Summary:

Annually,VRE prepares a Legislative Agenda to communicate its legislative priorities in coordination with the commissions and member jurisdictions. The Legislative Agenda addresses both state and federal issues.

RECOMMEND AUTHORIZATION TO SUBMIT A VRE APPLICATION TO THE NVTC I-66 COMMUTER CHOICE FY2025-2026 PROGRAM

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to recommend the commissions authorize the VRE CEO to submit, on behalf of the commissions, a VRE application(s) to the I-66 Commuter Choice FY 2025-2026 Program, to make any necessary corrections to the project amount or descriptions in the application(s) and execute all project funding agreements that may result from consideration of the VRE application(s).

Summary:

VRE has identified three capital and operating improvements to support planned service enhancements identified in the Transforming Rail in Virginia initiative that benefit toll payers, maximize person throughput, and provide enhanced multimodal choices in the I-66 travel corridor. They are:

- Service Enhancements on the Manassas Line (Priority I)
- Step-Up Service Restart on the Manassas Line and Fare Buy-Down (Priority 2)
- Capital Funding for VRE Alexandria Station Improvements (Priority 3)





POLICY FOR 360-DEGREE ASSESSMENT OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Recommendation:

By resolution, the VRE Operations Board may establish a policy for the conduct of a 360degree assessment for the CEO every three years as part of the annual evaluation process.

Summary:

To provide the Operations Board direct feedback from internal VRE staff concerning the CEO's performance, the Operations Board wishes to establish a predictable, consistent format and timeline for staff to provide direct feedback to the Operations Board. The 360-degree assessment will be conducted for the Operations Board as part of the annual evaluation process at a frequency no greater than three years. VRE staff will work with the CEO Evaluation Committee to process the 360-degree assessment every three years as part of the annual evaluation process beginning with the 2023 annual evaluation.

SPENDING AUTHORITY REPORT

On September 18, 2020, the VRE Operations Board approved increasing the CEO's delegated spending authority from \$100,000 to \$200,000. It was resolved as part of that increased delegation that any purchase or contract award in the range of \$50,000 to \$200,000 would be communicated to the board as an information item.

- On October 10, 2023, VRE issued a blanket purchase order in an amount not to exceed \$99,000 to Eleventh Creative LLC to provide graphic design services on an as-needed basis. Designs may include brochures, flyers, pocket schedules, posters, tickets, surveys, report documents, booklets, and web and social graphics in compliance with VRE's style guidelines.
- On October 13, 2023, VRE issued a task order in the amount of \$52,080 to ADS System Safety Consulting, LLC under the safety and security consulting services contract to develop a VRE Workplace Safety Program Plan.
- On October 13, 2023, VRE issued a task order in the amount of \$66,742 to ADS System Safety Consulting, LLC under the safety and security consulting services contract to conduct internal safety audits.

SPENDING AUTHORITY REPORT

- October 20, 2023, VRE issued a blanket purchase order in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 to Washington Overhead Door, Inc., utilizing an existing cooperative contract awarded by Loudoun County, to provide overhead door and security gate repair and maintenance services at VRE's maintenance and storage facilities on an as-needed basis.
- On October 25, 2023, VRE issued a sole source blanket purchase order in an amount not to exceed \$67,000 to RailPros Field Services, Inc. to provide FRA-mandated Roadway Worker Protection training on an as-needed basis to VRE staff and contractors working on or near active railroad tracks.
- On October 31, 2023, VRE issued a task order in the amount of \$52,800 to HDR Engineering, Inc. under the general engineering consulting services contract to develop specifications for modernization of the east elevator at Woodbridge Station.
