

CEO REPORT



REFERRAL OF THE AMENDED FY 2024 AND RECOMMENDED FY 2025 VRE OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGETS TO THE COMMISSIONS AND JURISDICTIONS

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to adopt the amended FY 2024 VRE Operating and Capital Budget and the recommended FY 2025 VRE Operating and Capital Budget and refer them to the commissions for their consideration and subsequent referral to the jurisdictions for their formal review and adoption; and to recommend the commissions authorize the executive directors of NVTC and PRTC to take the necessary actions to apply for federal and state grant funding.

Summary:

Following the presentation of the preliminary FY 2025 budget in September and the budget updates in October and November, staff is presenting the recommended FY 2025 operating and capital budget for adoption and referral. The recommended budget is balanced, with no funding gap, and with all projected uses of funding in FY 2025 supported by reasonably expected sources of funding. The FY 2025 budget includes a 5 percent increase to passenger fares as compared to FY 2024 and a total jurisdictional subsidy contribution of \$18.3 million.





IMPROVING AND EXPANDING SERVICE

- Opportunities for service enhancements on weekdays to partially offset new costs
- Total increase in service (train miles) of about 8 percent
- Planned inauguration of Saturday service
- Three round-trip trains on each line with service northbound in the morning and southbound in the afternoon/evening
- All changes contingent upon final approval of host railroads, operations and maintenance contractor, and other key stakeholders

Public feedback was generally positive/supportive for all recommended fare changes, as well as for planned Saturday service

- Subsidy would be ~\$22 million if had grown with inflation since 2021
- Pandemic relief funds continue to provide support, but will not last forever
- Ridership return slower than hoped, jurisdictional support critical to continued recovery




FY 2025 EXPENSE DRIVERS

- Costs reflect Saturday service implementation and weekday savings opportunities
- Major contracts with Keolis/host railroads/Amtrak services escalated with inflation (CPI and AAR)
- Diesel fuel: \$3.25/gallon and 1.83 million gallons
- Insurance: annual market-based increases and expanded coverages (e.g., cyber)
- Recommend adding two FTEs: Facilities and Information Technology positions to meet expanding requirements
- Nothing deferred: continue to deliver safe, cost effective, accessible, and reliable commuter-oriented service, with additional focus on attracting new riders



USE OF PANDEMIC RELIEF FUNDS

- Use of relief funds is downstream of ridership return and our policy decisions on subsidy, fares, etc.
- Will use more funds in FY 2024 than originally budgeted as ridership return has been below projections

AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE AN MEC VII TASK ORDER FOR ENGINEERING OVERSIGHT FOR NEW PASSENGER RAILCARS PHASE III

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to authorize the CEO to issue a mechanical engineering consulting services task order to STV Inc. for engineering oversight for new passenger railcars phase III in the amount of \$1,362,608, plus a 10 percent contingency of \$136,261, for a total not to exceed \$1,498,869.

Summary:

The Federal Transit Administration, Federal Railroad Administration, and other regulating or funding partners require VRE to perform engineering oversight for design reviews, first article inspections, in-plant inspections, and other on-site inspections of all new passenger railcars. This action will provide those services through a mechanical engineering consulting services task order with STV Inc. for VRE's base order of 21 new passenger railcars, which are being manufactured by Alstom Transportation Inc.

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT FOR LOCOMOTIVE LAYOVER BATTERY CHARGING SYSTEMS

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to authorize the CEO to execute a contract with Dina Consulting & Design, LLC of Caldwell, Idaho for locomotive layover battery charging systems in the amount of \$321,732, plus a 10 percent contingency of \$32,173, for a total amount not to exceed \$353,905.

Summary:

Locomotive battery charging systems are required to ensure proper maintenance and function of the nickel-cadmium batteries utilized by VRE's fleet of locomotives. The current locomotive layover battery charging systems are increasingly experiencing failures and have reached the end of their useful life thus necessitating replacement. The new charging systems will be installed by VRE's maintenance contractor, Keolis Rail Services Virginia, once received.

AUTHORIZATION TO EXTEND A LICENSE AGREEMENT FOR THE LEASE OF TOWER SPACE FOR THE VHF RADIO COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM

Recommendation:

The VRE Operations Board is asked to authorize the CEO to extend a license agreement with American Towers, Inc. for the lease of space on their cell tower located in Fairfax Station, Virginia, for a period of five years at a cost of \$224,324 for the five-year period and a total authorization of \$728,748 over the 20-year term of the license agreement.

Summary:

VRE operates a VHF two-way radio communications system for communication between VRE trains and VRE Headquarters. The radio system operates utilizing transmitters and other equipment installed on a network of towers, including two rooftop antennas in Alexandria, a tower at Leeland Road and the tower in Fairfax Station that is owned by American Towers, Inc.

SPENDING AUTHORITY REPORT

On September 18, 2020, the VRE Operations Board approved increasing the CEO's delegated spending authority from \$100,000 to \$200,000. It was resolved as part of that increased delegation that any purchase or contract award in the range of \$50,000 to \$200,000 would be communicated to the board as an information item.

- November 6, 2023, VRE issued a task order in the amount of \$59,800 to HDR Engineering, Inc. under the general engineering consulting services contract to provide the design for renovations to the Quantico station house.
- On November 7, 2023, VRE issued a sole source purchase order in the amount of \$69,828 to Paragon Products, LLC to purchase a total of 22 new fuel pumps for VRE's fleet of locomotives.
- On November 17, 2023, VRE issued a task order in the amount of \$140,830 to U.S. Facilities, Inc. under the maintenance services for VRE facilities contract to grade and pave the access road leading to the Crossroads Maintenance and Storage Facility.
- On November 18, 2023, VRE issued a purchase order in the amount of \$54,276 to National Auto Fleet Group, utilizing an existing cooperative contract, to purchase a new Ford F-250 pickup truck to augment the vehicles in VRE's fleet used by staff responsible for facilities maintenance.






PROJECT OVERVIEW

ADJACENT PROJECTS & RELATED FUNDING – PHASE I

- VPRA / CSXTAlexandria FourthTrack (AF to RO)
 - Funded by VPRA as part of TRV
 - Design and construction by CSXT
 - Construction anticipated 2024 (utility) 2025 (track)
- VRE Crystal City Station
 - Coordinated closely with FourthTrack design and construction sequence
 - Funded (partially) by NVTA and NVTC



ADJACENT PROJECTS & RELATED FUNDING – PHASE 2

CC2DCA Connection of Crystal City to Airport

- Led by Arlington County assisted by VDOT
- Funded (partially) by NVTA
- NEPA completion anticipated in early 2024

Amtrak High-Level Platform

- Requires gauntlet track
- In service once Long Bridge project is completed by VPRA



BENEFITS OF RECOMMENDED PHASED APPROACH

- Enhances Constructability (Safety and Operations)
 - Reduces construction between active tracks
- Allows Delivery of Station Coordinated with FourthTrack
 - Critical to construct platform prior to FourthTrack
- Permits Open Design of CC2DCA Connector Alternatives
 - Design is not constrained infrastructure built by VRE
- Enhances Continuity and Appearance of Adjacent Structures
 - Bridge to JBG Smith and bridge to DCA similar in size and architecture



NEXT STEPS

- Advance to 90% Design
 - Seek board authorization at January meeting
- Continued Coordination with Stakeholders
 - Agreements with JBG Smith, CSXT and VPRA
- Public Outreach
 - Meet the Management (Spring of '24)
 - Project-specific events


