

## Notice of Opportunity to Comment on Proposed Changes to VRE Passenger Tariff

The Virginia Railway Express (VRE) is accepting public comment on changes to fares proposed in its preliminary fiscal year 2025 budget. VRE's Public Participation Policy (https://bit.ly/3rqtoWZ) states: "Any proposed amendment to the VRE Passenger Tariff (https://bit.ly/3ZBqGL2) involving an increase in fares or major change in service, as defined in the Major Service & Fare/Service Equity Policy (https://bit.ly/3RFLOxs), shall be open to public comment at a public hearing."

The public comment period runs from 9 a.m. on Friday, September 29 through 5 p.m. on Thursday, November 16, 2023. Individuals interested in providing comment may do so at one of three in-person public hearings, or via mail, email, telephone or fax. Public hearings are scheduled for:

VRE's preliminary FY 2025 operating budget totals \$119.9 million, which includes operations, maintenance, and existing debt service. This is an increase of \$11.0 million or 10 percent over the approved FY 2024 operating budget. The budget includes increases to fares of 5 percent and the jurisdictional subsidy of 14 percent. VRE's last broad-based fare increase was 3 percent in FY 2020.

The proposed budget provides for the first-ever operation of VRE weekend service, as well as a proposal to allow children under 18 to ride free and changes to simplify fare payment.

VRE, the nation's 13th largest commuter rail service, connects parts of Central and Northern Virginia with the District of Columbia. VRE is recognized for its provision of safe, reliable, convenient, and comfortable transportation. Its two lines, Manassas and Fredericksburg, serve 19 stations, including two – L'Enfant and Union Station – in Washington, D.C. Additional information about VRE service is available at www.vre.org.
